

## How to Drive Through a Roundabout:

# ALWAYS YIELD TO CIRCULATING TRAFFIC



Enter only when there is a safe gap in traffic.

Yield to pedestrians and bicyclists using crosswalks.

Yield to **all** traffic coming from the left.

Circulating traffic has the right-of-way. Never stop within a roundabout. Continue to your exit.

The entering driver (**red**) is at fault for failing to yield to circulating traffic (**green**).

The driver in the inside lane of the roundabout can either continue circulating **or** exit.

Entering vehicles must yield to all lanes coming from the left.



## YIELD:

The “Golden Rule” of roundabouts.

Drivers entering a roundabout must yield to circulating traffic, pedestrians and bicyclists.

Drivers already in the circle have the right of way. A driver approaching a roundabout must wait for a safe gap in traffic before entering.
